




- Bullying almost disappeared as a result.




All students need to be treated the same and follow the same path for administrative efficiency.

Response:

 "Yes" is the default answer to any student, parent or teacher request. Unless approving the change will take too much time, too much money or negatively impact on someone else.





Students have no rights to decide who teaches them or who cares for them.

- Students can choose to change classes provided there is space in another class.
- Students can change their Mentor (Primary Carer at school) or Head of House if they feel more comfortable with someone else.
- Students sit on staff selection panels



Only adults should ever be permitted to support and give health advice to students.

- Student Health & Wellbeing Ambassadors
- Trained in
 - ✓ First Aid,
 - ✓ Mental Health,
 - ✓ Sexual Education,
 - ✓ Drug Education
- Appropriately scaffolded and monitored
- Allows wellbeing staff to concentrate on serious cases



Students can't be trusted to make their own decisions Left to their own devices, students will pursue nothing of real value.

Response:

- Students select their own course form over 50-150 electives.
- No compulsory subjects once literacy and numeracy are established
- Many choose to accelerate their learning rather than taking easy options.

Students, supported by their teachers and parents, are able to make high quality decisions in their own best interests. Take Control Philosophy

A school doesn't have the resources to tailor education for the individual.

- Individualised Learning Plans for all
- Written by students using a template
- Supported by Staff and Parents
- Signed off by Parent and Principal
- 5 Year planning horizon





Students have nothing of value to contribute to the running of the school.

- Student Congress must be consulted before any significant school decision
- Over 10% of students are employed by the school over the year


