WHAT DOES STATE GOVERNMENT DO?

There is often confusion surrounding the three levels of Government and the representatives associated with.

State/territory governments administer and set laws, and provides services not covered by the Federal Government; for instance, hospitals, schools, police and housing services. The Federal Government has broad national powers and administers (puts into action) laws and provides services in relation to defence, immigration, foreign affairs, trade, postal services and taxation. The powers of Local Councils are defined by Acts of Parliament passed by State Parliaments and include responsibility for building regulations, rubbish collection, local roads and pet control.

The role of a Member of Parliament (MP) is a multi-functional one. We have a responsibility to our constituents as well to greater Queensland, giving assistance and advice to those in difficulty and making representations on your behalf, either to State Government departments or to the relevant Ministers. As with every process there are rules we must follow. MP's are regulated, and rightfully so, to not become involved or interfere with cases that are in a judicial process, including civil matters already in the courts or an appeal process with first instance tribunals such as QLD Civil & Administrative Tribunal (QCAT). As a State MP it is also inappropriate in my role to interfere in the way local council conducts its business.

MP's advocate for change whether that be cultural or through legislation, and negotiating outcomes sought by their community as a whole or for individuals. This can be through direct appeal, various speeches or Questions with or without Notice, and importantly through the casting of our vote to Bills brought before Chamber. The greatest juggle between competing priorities is finding the time balance between research of Bills, consulting with stakeholders and community, and attending the hundreds of meetings, events, seminars and functions both at home and in Brisbane. Most appreciated are those moments when you are out amongst the community without a time allocation!


