
Top 3 local-specific State Government issues:


Survey respondents identified these as the top 3 most important issues for Noosa:













NB: While 22% indicated other priorities, the majority were providing further comment on priorities listed already and there was no additional issue that was raised by more than a few percent of survey respondents.












NB: While 18% indicated other priorities, the majority were providing further comment on priorities listed already and there was no additional issue that was raised by more than a few percent of survey respondents.















