

Cooroy Gympie Road landslip repairs North Coast Region – Natural Disaster Program

August 2024

The Department of Transport and Main Roads' (TMR) contractor will soon begin landslip repairs on Cooroy-Gympie Road locally known as the Old Bruce Highway, Pomona. **A map of the works is shown on the reverse of this flyer.** Additional minor repairs will be undertaken later in the year.

Major reconstruction works will start **late August 2024** and will take approximately **one month to complete**, weather and construction conditions permitting.



Key works

- Excavating, clearing and grubbing
- Rock anchors/soil nailing
- Rock mattresses, shotcrete, and pavement construction
- Hydromulching



What to expect

- Reconstruction will be undertaken at two sites on the Cooroy – Gympie Road, Pomona.
- Work will generally be undertaken Monday to Friday, between 6.30am and 6.30pm.
- During works, heavy machinery including excavators, concrete trucks, drilling rigs, and mobile cranes will be accessing the work sites.
- Traffic controllers, reduced speed limits, road signage, and variable message signs will be in place to advise of the changed traffic conditions, and to ensure motorist and road worker safety.
- The work sites will be reduced to one lane during work hours.
- Nearby residents may experience noise, vibration, and dust from construction activities.
- Reversing beepers and flashing lights are a safety requirement and will be used during works.
- Motorists may experience delays and are encouraged to drive to the changed traffic conditions, obey signage, and reduced speed limits.
- Priority access through the work site will be given to emergency vehicles.

TMR understands roadworks can be frustrating for nearby residents, businesses, and road users and acknowledges your cooperation and patience during works.

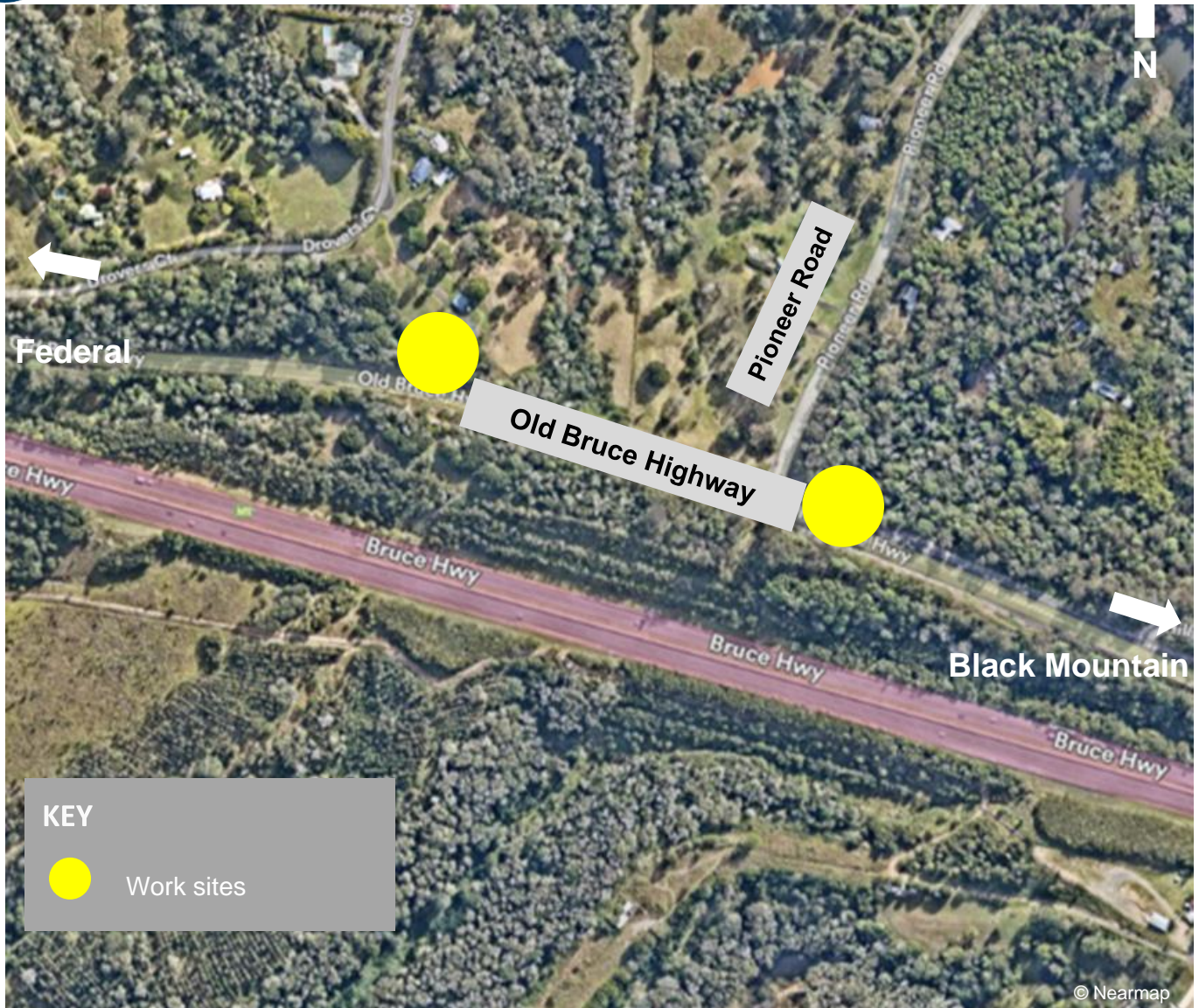
